Learning at Vyners

All students are expected to work hard and do their very best. This ensures that they are active learners and makes being in lessons an exciting and rewarding experience.



We provide a broad and balanced curriculum that offers all students the opportunity to succeed in the workplace and society of the 21st century. We teach students the skills to be effective learners and encourage in them a love of learning that they will foster throughout their life.

A dedicated team of professional, skilled and well qualified teachers and associate staff provide outstanding learning experiences for students. Students are encouraged to be curious, independent learners supported at home by parents and carers who play a critical part in their development towards becoming responsible young citizens. The school has invested significantly in developing the quality of the learning environment, refurbishing the interior and exterior of the buildings so that it provides an inspirational, welcoming ethos where success is openly celebrated.







Life at Vyners

The education we provide at Vyners School extends well beyond the classroom. We strive to develop well-rounded individuals, giving them the cultural awareness and leadership skills needed to be successful in life.







The energy and enthusiasm of our students and staff are evident in a wide range of co-curricular activities and all members of the school are encouraged to take advantage of the opportunities available. We excel in music as demonstrated by our award winning Vyners Swing Band, along with our junior and senior orchestras, African drummers, Ukulele choir and many others. Our Christmas, summer and instrumental concerts provide a showcase for the wealth of musical talent in the school. Our large scale drama productions take place every 2 years and are a much anticipated part of the school calendar. Recent shows include 'Our House,' 'Hairspray' and 'Sister Act'.

Vyners continues to be successful in its sporting endeavours, with success throughout the borough in rugby, football, hockey and netball, to name a few. We encourage all students to find a sport that they love, and activities on offer range from archery and trampolining to mountain biking and handball.

The Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme is a core feature of activity in Years 9-13, with large numbers of students completing the Bronze Award and Sixth Formers embarking on their Silver and Gold Awards.

Opportunities for students also extend abroad with a skiing trip to Austria, cultural visits to France, Germany and Spain and a range of sporting tours (football, rugby and netball).

The Sixth Form at Vyners

The Sixth Form is an integral and highly successful part of the school community.

The majority of our Year 11 students continue their education in the Sixth Form.





Nearly all our students progress on to higher education, including entries to the very best universities in the country as well as overseas. Recently there have been increasing numbers of students accessing high quality apprenticeships as an alternative to higher education. Vyners students have acquired placements at British Airways, the BBC, Cisco, Google, Jaguar and Rolls-Royce, to name a few.

The Sixth Form has its own identity but the students play a significant role as leaders within our wider school community as Prefects, House Captains, Sports Leaders and role models. All students contribute to the whole school through community work, supporting younger students in lessons and delivering lectures and assemblies.

As students move through the Sixth Form they are assured of expert guidance from experienced subject staff, tutors and the pastoral team as they deal with the challenges of entry into higher education, employment, training or gap years. We have a dedicated member of staff who works to identify and mentor potential Oxbridge candidates as well as supporting all students with their UCAS applications.

For me, Vyners was more than a mere education facility. It was a community of friendly students and staff committed to helping me develop as an individual. This began in Year 7, when the teachers helped stretch my understanding beyond the reaches of the curriculum, and continued all the way through sixth form, with staff who went above and beyond to nurture my love of the subjects. The outstanding example of this was when I was given a great deal of support with my (subsequently successful) application to read Philosophy, Politics and Economics at Oxford. Teachers across several subjects helped me through the process by marking practice questions, meeting regularly with me and conducting mock interviews, which gave me more confidence and significantly contributed to the success of my application.

Outside of academic studies, Vyners provided me with excellent opportunities to develop leadership skills, particularly through School Council and the leadership development training given to us by Mr. Mullings. I also enjoyed taking part in two of the school bands, including the Vyners Swing Band, and performing in the termly concerts.

However, my lasting memories of Vyners come from the sense of community. Teachers, some of whom hadn't taught me in several years, would still greet me cheerfully in the corridor, and I made many friendships that have continued after we left Vyners. Overall, Vyners gave me confidence to stretch and challenge myself, while presenting opportunities to give back by serving the community, and enriching my extracurricular activities. These experiences continue to be of much value to me.




